## CONSENSUS CONFERENCE ON THE PERIOPERATIVE AND SURGICAL MANAGEMENT OF ESOPHAGEAL ATRESIA WITH TRACHEOESOPHAGEAL FISTULA, BERLIN, 25TH-26TH OCTOBER

The mission of the ERN on rare Inherited and Congenital Anomalies (ERNICA) is the promotion of optimal patient care, providing high quality and improving clinical standards across Europe. Many aspects of the current management of patients with esophageal atresia (EA) and tracheoesophageal fistula (TEF) are still controversial, and there is only little evidence for best diagnostic therapeutic practice. As a consequence, the members of the *ERNICA Esophageal Workstream* agreed to perform a conference to establish consensus based on the latest evidence from the literature and expert opinion. Twenty representatives from ERNICA institutions who are extensively experienced in the treatment of patients with EA were invited. The group of participants included pediatric surgeons, a pediatric gastroenterologist, a methodologist and representatives of patient support groups.

The consensus conference took place on Thursday, the 25<sup>th</sup> October and Friday, 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018 in the Aesculap Academy in Berlin, Germany. After an extensive literature search and preparation, relevant aspects with regard to diagnostic, pre-, intra-, and postoperative management as well as regarding follow-up of patients with EA/TEF were discussed, and consensus was reached on 60 items important in the care of patients with EA/TEF after an anonymous online voting process. The consensus statements are about to be published for further use throughout Europe in the European Journal of Pediatric Surgery. This consensus paper will facilitate dissemination of evidence, standardisation and improvement of patient care, and will contribute to reducing the morbidity in patients with EA/TEF.
